Duties

The Occupational Medical Service (Betriebsärztlicher Dienst – BÄD) offers advice on occupational health and safety at Technische Universität Berlin. The Medical Officers' duties follow mainly from the provisions contained in the Occupational Safety Act (Arbeitssicherheitsgesetz – ASiG) and the Occupational Health and Safety Act (Arbeitsschutzgesetz – ArbSchG). The following factors are taken into account when giving occupational medical advice: ergonomics of workplaces; physical, chemical and biological influences; the design of procedures and workflows; and the use of personal protective equipment.

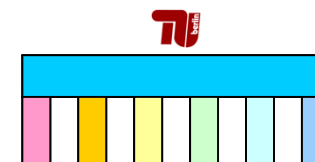
The Occupational Medical Service offers consultation on rehabilitation after long periods of illness, as well as medical and travel advice for business trips, and vaccinations and First Aid in cases of acute illness or accident. The Medical Officers also contribute to the Promotion of Workplace Health.

They work together with the security technicians, the Social Service, the Staff Council, the Representative of Severely Disabled Employees and the representatives of other university divisions.
